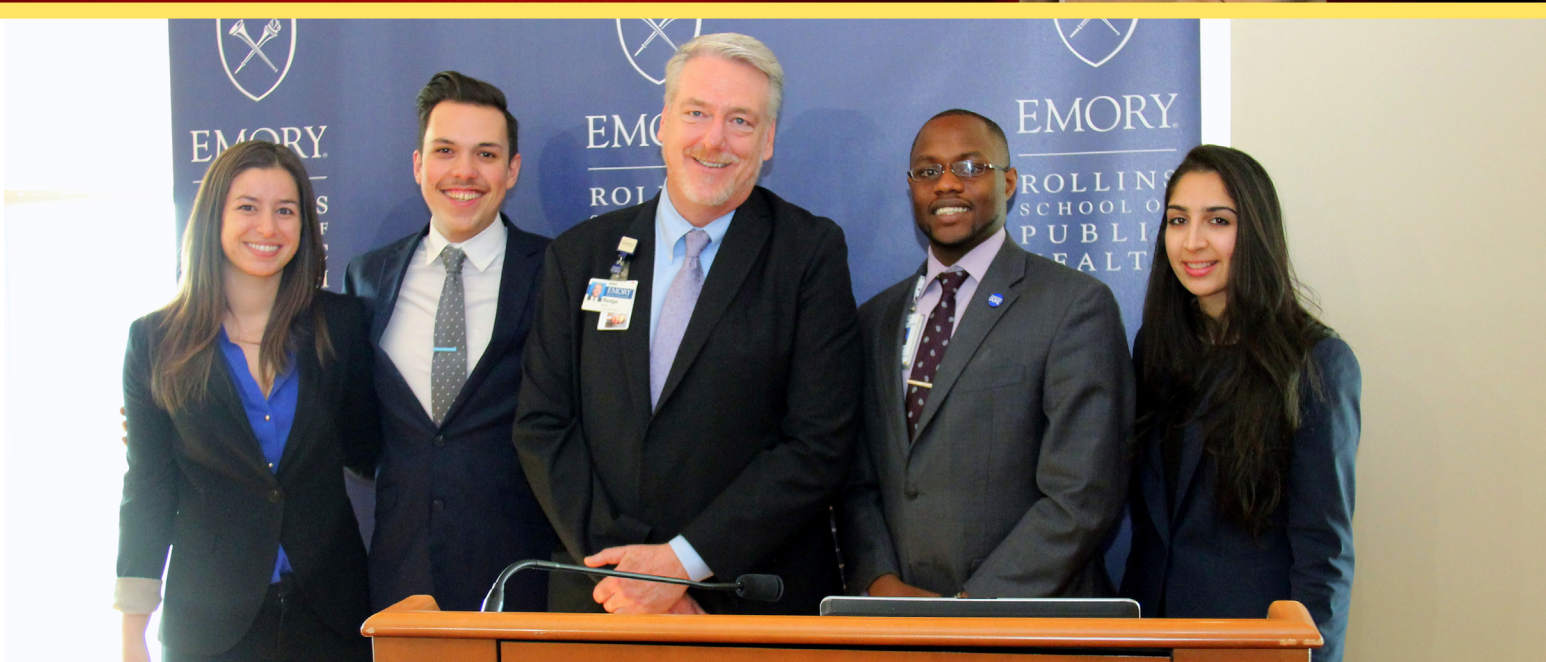


OUR MISSION is to advance knowledge of the importance of access, cost, and delivery of health care by training today's leaders in health policy, health services research, and health care management.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

The Department of Health Policy & Management seeks students who will excel academically and enrich the campus and classroom environments. Our admissions process is holistic, meaning we take the whole student into account.

MSPH REQUIREMENTS:

MSPH students are required to complete a thesis related to a health services research topic. Prior research experience is preferred but not required. MSPH applicants must have strong quantitative skills.

FUNDING

Rollins offers scholarships, financial aid awards, and work study that allow students to support

their academic interests. Most Rollins students take advantage of paid work opportunities through the Rollins Earn and Learn (REAL) program.

The Global Field Experience Program at Rollins also provides financial support to current students working in low- resource or high-disparities settings through a competitive review process.
