

You can now request the PBB records of your deceased family members!

1. Fill out a request form for your next of kin's PBB records

If you are the next of kin of a deceased member of the state's Long-Term PBB Study you may request your deceased family member's PBB records **to be sent to you**. Next of kin includes parent, legal guardian, spouse, or heir (children/grandchildren) of the deceased.

The next of kin should submit a request for the deceased's records by completing the *Michigan Long-Term PBB Study Next of Kin Request for Transfer of Records* form.

2. Include all necessary legal documents

- Copy of valid photo ID
- Copy of deceased's death certificate
- Legal documentation that proves you are next of kin to the deceased (e.g. birth or marriage certificates)
