## **Applying for Graduation**

<u>Graduation Applications</u> for Spring 2021 Graduates are due on Friday, February 19, 2021. You will find the online degree application in the Graduation and Commencement tile in OPUS. If you anticipate graduating in May 2021 and the Graduation and Commencement tile (see below) is unavailable to you, please contact your ADAP. Your ADAP will confirm your expected graduation date with RSPH Enrollment Services Office. Once that has been confirmed, your expected graduation date will be changed in OPUS. At that time, the link to apply for graduation will be available to you in OPUS within 24 hours of the change. The link to apply in OPUS will close February 19, 2021.

Dual Degree Students: You must submit a degree application to both schools in which you are receiving your degree:

- You will apply in OPUS for the degree of the school in which you are currently enrolled.
- A <u>paper degree application</u>, should be submitted to the other school.

Students who do not submit an online application by February 19<sup>th</sup>, must submit a <u>paper degree</u> <u>application</u> to the Enrollment Services Office in the School of Public Health via <u>rsphenrollmentservices@emory.edu</u>.

#### Updating Your Diploma Address & Submitting a Name Change

All diplomas will be mailed to the diploma address indicated on OPUS. Please take the time to review the following information:

- **Diploma Mailing Address:** Be sure to review and, if necessary, update your **Diploma Mailing Address** in OPUS. This is important for making sure that you receive your diploma in a timely manner.
- **Diploma Email Address**: Be sure to navigate to your email addresses and ensure we have a non-Emory email address for you by adding a "Diploma" Email Address.
- Be sure to review your name in OPUS. <u>Your name as it appears in OPUS will be the name</u> <u>printed on your diploma</u>. The deadline to submit a <u>name change form</u> is **February 28, 2021**.
