







The Hubert Department of Global Health (GH) Class of 2016, with 103 graduates, includes those who graduated in August 2015, December 2015 and May 2016.




International Student Status (N = 103)

This chart indicates the percentage of international student graduates from the GH department with a MPH/MSPH degree.




Years of Prior Work Experience (N = 102)

Employment Status (N = 103)


This chart indicates the employment status of the graduated class of 103 within 11-months post-graduation from the GH department.


Employment by Sector (N = 66)

Job Search Period (N = 66)


Within the first 4 months of starting the job search, 71% secured employment.*



*Many graduates begin seeking employment in the months prior to graduation.


Number of Resumes Sent Out (N = 66)

The median starting annual salary range reported by GH graduates securing full-time/part-time employment is \$50,000—\$59,999.




