Rollins Earn And Learn (REAL) Program	Master years 1 & 2	Students earn \$15/hour up to the award limit of \$6,000 per academic year. The salary split between Emory and the partner is 50/50, so the most the organization is responsible for under the program is \$3000/year.	Up to 20 hours/week during the academic year, Sept-May (Oct-May for the CDC).	Employers are encouraged to post in the RSPH Career Connection (called 12twenty).	Employers may post on 12twenty and students apply from Aug 1 – early September; for spring-only positions, students will apply beginning late fall.	real@emory.edu
<p>The REAL program provides funding for master level public health graduate students to support their academic interests with applied public health experiences in federal, state, and county government agencies, Emory and Emory-affiliated programs, and other organizations. Applied Practice Experience (APE)	Master years 1 & 2	Funding source can vary: Via REAL (see above), the employer pays student's hourly rate, or the student volunteers (non-paid).	Suggested that students work a max of 20 hours/week when school is in session and full-time in summer. Students can start after they earn 9 course credits (usually starting January of their first year or later).	Employers are encouraged to post in the RSPH Career Connection (called 12twenty).	Ongoing; Sept/Oct and Jan-Apr are when most students seek this type of work. <p>For APE: All RSPH master students are required to work at least 200 hours in a public health setting between their second and final semester. Students apply knowledge and skills acquired through their courses and gain experience in the field. Visit the APE Website (including a supervisor's handbook).</p>						
Merit Scholars Assistantship	Select master years 1 & 2	Rollins pays a monthly stipend directly to the student; the funding allows top students to match with a supervisor and create a job description at no cost to the employer.	12-15 hours/week during the academic year (Sept-early May). Integrated Learning Experience (ILE) Project	Master year 2	Students do not receive payment for conducting this project unless it is conducted with an employer and incorporated into the work.	Varies depending if they are also employed for the project, then see "Applied Practice Experience" and "Student Employment." Global Field Experience (GFE)	Summer between master years 1 & 2	Students may apply for GFE mini-grants from RSPH to work in global settings. They must have a project identified with an organization. The organization generally provides some level of support/resources to the student.	Minimum of six weeks in the summer (mid-May through mid-August).
